Careers - Provider Access Policy

Rationale

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer.

This complies with the school's legal obligations under:

- Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.
- Section 72 of the Education and Skills Act 2008.
- Careers strategy: making the most of everyone's skills and talents - December 2017.

Student entitlement

All students in years 7-13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

For students of compulsory school age, these opportunities are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two during each of Year 7 - 9, Year 10 - 11, and Year 12 - 13.

These will be scheduled within the school day and the provider will be given adequate time to, as a minimum:

- Share information about the provider and the approved technical education qualifications or apprenticeships they offer;
- Explain the variety of careers routes their options could lead to;
- Provide a description of what learning or training with the provider is like;
- Provide an opportunity for students to meet with the providers, ask questions and gain a 'career-focussed' experience.
